



CPAnet: the challenges of gaining evidence-based knowledge in chronic pulmonary aspergillosis

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Chronic pulmonary aspergillosis is a destructive fungal disease complicating many respiratory disorders. CPA is a long-term infection of the lung caused by moulds of the genus *Aspergillus*. In Europe, the majority of cases are caused by *A. fumigatus*. About three million people are diagnosed with CPA globally, mostly complicating tuberculosis, allergic bronchopulmonary aspergillosis (ABPA) or sarcoidosis [2].
